A COPY OF TELEGRAMS RELATING TO SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR

PUBLISHED DAILY.

TO OUR READERS.

At the solicitude of a great many people of all nationalities, arrangements have been made for the publishing of a daily bulletin of all press telegrams relating to the Spanish-American war.

As these telegrams will be received in Veracruz at the same time that they are received in Mexico City, and published immediately, the news will be from twelve to twenty-four hours earlier than that received in news papers published in Mexico City.

This telegraphic service, being a complete copy of all press despatches sent to Mexico City is very costly, and every person interested in receiving this war news promptly is requested to help sustain the War Bulletin by prepaying one month's subscription, \$1.50 cts. Only persons having a letter duly signed by Carlos B. Carothers conferring such authority, are authorized to take subscriptions, and each subscriber will sign the list and give the address at which the Bulletin is to be delivered.

RUNNING THE BLOCKADE

Havana, April 28. — The Spanish coaster Cosme Herrera and the Spanish Steamer Aviles ran the blockade and reached here safely today.

AMERICAN SCHOONER CAPTURED

Manila, April 28. — The Spaniards captured the American Schooner Sarauac

today, loaded with coal. It is believed that this coal was for the American Squadron, in which case the loss will be very keenly felt by the Americans.

PORTUGAL DISCUSSING NEUTRALITY

Spanish fleet will have to leave the waters of Cape Verde.

Lisbon, April 28. — Tomorrow there will be a special meeting of the Cabinet to discuss Portuguese neutrality.

Lisbon, April 28. — The Spaniards will be given notice to take their fleet out of the waters of Cape Verde.

Key West, April 28. — While the Spanish vessel Ambrosio Bolivar was trying to run the blockade and enter Cardenas Bay, on the north coast of Cuba she was taken by the American Monitor Terror. She carries 20 Passengers and six thousand dollars Gold.

MATANZAS BOMBARDED.

Key West, April 28. — Today the American fleet bombarded Matanzas. It is reported that in a very few minutes all the Spanish batteries were quiet. Spanish losses were very heavy.

MANILA AND THE SPANISH PACIFIC SQUADRON THREATENED.

Hong Kong, April 28. — Yesterday the American Fleet sailed from Manilla with the object of finding and destroying the Spanish Squadron.

PORTUGAL DEBEA

TORPEDEROS ESPAÑOLES EN EL MEDITERRANEO

Abril 28, Madrid. — Las noticias recibidas dicen respecto al bombardeo de las tanzas que la flota de los Estados Unidos tuvo que retirarse después de media hora de fuego.

Lisboa Abril 28. — El Gobierno ha prohibido la trasmisión pública de despachos relativos á los movimientos de los buques de guerra en los puertos del Reino. — Esta prohibición prueba que Portugal desea ayudar á España.

Dícese que McKinley hubiera mandado una nota á Portugal informándole que le consideraría como aliado de España si no retiraba la flota española de San Vicente.

Gibraltar, Abril 28. — Dos contratorpederos españoles cruzan el estrecho Gibraltar y aproxímanse todos los buques saliendo del Mediterraneo para constatar su nacionalidad.

ESCUADRA ESPAÑOLA SALIO DE CABO VERDE RUMBO A LOS ESTADOS UNIDOS DESEA EMBARCAR CARBÓN EN TERRANOVA

Abril 28, París. — Por parte de la flota de Madrid se sabe que la Escuadra Española salió de Cabo Verde el 26 rumbo á los Estados Unidos. Se cree va á bombardear los puertos de la costa Septentrional americana.

Abril 26, Terranova. — Se anuncia que la escuadra de Cabo Verde llegará aquí con objeto de embarcar carbón.

Abril 28, Cadiz. — Un contratorpedero y tres torpederos Españoles han salido para cazar los yachts de ricos americanos en el Mediterraneo.

Madrid, Abril 28. — Los prelados Españoles se han presentado á la Reina Regente expresándole su adhesión y ofreciéndole su apoyo en circunstancias actuales.

ARMAS Y MUNICIONES PARA MAXIMO GOMEZ.

Abril 28, New York. — Seis furgones cargados de cañones, municiones y armas salieron ayer, van consignados á Máximo Gomez serán embarcados en Tampa y custodiada por los buques de guerra americanos.

ARMS AND AMMUNITION FOR MAXIMO GOMEZ.

New York, April 28. — Six cars loaded with cannons, arms and ammunition left here yesterday, consigned to Maximo Gomez they will be embarked in Florida and will be guarded by the American vessels of war.

April 28, Madrid. — The advices received concerning the bombardment of Matanzas state that the American fleet had retire after firing for half an hour.

PORTUGAL WISHES TO HELP SPAIN.

April 28, Lisbon. — The Government has prohibited the public transmission of notices relating to the movements of ships of war in the ports of the Kingdom. This prohibition proves that Portugal wishes to help Spain.

SPANISH TORPEDO BOATS IN THE MEDITERRANEAN.

Gibraltar, April 28 th. — Two Spanish torpedo catchers are crossing the Straits of Gibraltar and they approach all vessels leaving the Mediterranean to assure themselves of their nationality.

SPANISH SQUADRON HAS LEFT CAIRO VERDE GOES TOWARDS THE UNITED STATES. WANTS TO TAKE COAL IN NEWFOUNDLAND

April 28, Paris. — A letter has been received from Madrid stating that the Spanish Squadron left Cabo Verde on the 26 th, and that it was going towards the United States.

It is believed that it will bombard the ports on the east coast of America.

April 28, Newfoundland — It is reported that the Spanish squadron will arrive here and that it desires for coal here.

Will try to catch American yachts.

Cadiz, April 28 — One torpedo catcher and three torpedo boats have left here to chase yachts belonging to the American in the Mediterranean.

Spanish clergy.

Madrid, April 28 — A deputation of the Spanish clergy has been presented to the Queen Regent and have assured her of their adhesion and have offered their help in the present circumstances.
